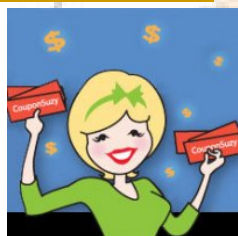

Qualifications: must possess GED or high school diploma, must be at least 24 years old on date you apply, must be legally single/widowed/or divorced, must have a Philadelphia residential mailing address, must be a legal US citizen, must not have any default student loans from past trade, technical, business school, or college attempts anywhere in the US, must have never before enrolled in classes at Community College of Philadelphia, must have not been required to pay taxes for 2013 or did pay taxes for 2013 and electronically filed, must have been sentenced and served time in a county/state/or federal correctional facility, must have been released from a county/state/or federal correctional facility in the past 5 years, and must not possess any convictions for violent sex offenses or arson.

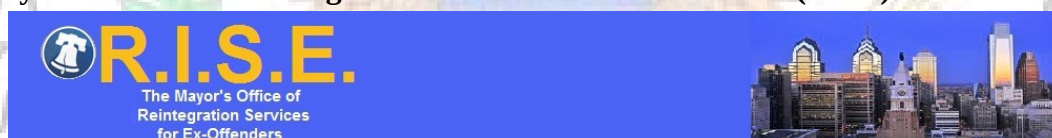

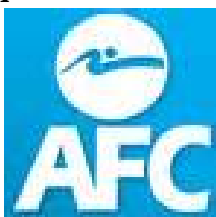
